**Conference Purpose:**

For the eighth consecutive year the Oregon Statewide Palliative Care Conference will bring together palliative care and hospice leaders to foster collaboration, community and promote best practices. Featuring experts from the fields of medicine, nursing, social work, psychology, chaplaincy, child-life, and music thanatology this year's conference includes a broad array of offerings in areas such as pediatrics, palliative care research and pain management.

**Target Audience:**

**Keynote Speaker: Deborah L Grassman, RN, MS, ANP**

Deborah Grassman has been with the VA for 27 years and has directed the 14 bed Hospice program at the Bay Pines VA Medical Center in St. Petersburg Florida VA for the last 17 years. This includes both home based hospice care and intensive inpatient hospice/palliative care for intractable suffering requiring intensive treatment. She has been a keynotes speaker at the National Conference of The American Academy of Hospice and Palliative Medicine, 2010, and has spoken at Hospice and VA conferences in 45 states. She is a recognized authority on providing Hospice care to veterans. She pioneered identifying the effects of past trauma on the quality of a person's dying process, as well as the influence of the various cultures of war on dying veterans. She is the author of the book, *Peace at Last: Stories of Hope and Healing for Veterans and their Families*.
